Wednesday World of Leisure (This is creek day)

All campers must have protective shoes to wear in the creek—no flip-flops, please.

Thursday World of Family (This is food day—campers will not need to bring a lunch)

Campers will explore the importance of family through storytelling and a visit to the graveyard.

Campers may tell a story about their own family if they wish, as we decorate the graves.

Campers will learn about the writing of wills in the past through roleplay.

Campers will try their hand at embroidery and/or whittling with soap.

Campers will make their own soup, biscuits, and cobbler.

Campers will learn what kept small nineteenth-century communities together through various activities like a visit to Burlington for Court Day, visiting a sick neighbor, and taking part in a jury trial. Campers will eat lunch early.
