## January

- 1 We all got back to Sally's house in Santa Barbara last night safe and well thank God. Sally, Frank, myself, Jack and nurse Miss Crangle and Beth the cook—after an absence of ten days. We have been on a visit to Ajo Arizona to John Greenway's home. The baby and attendants went on to Isabella's house and we found all well here and expecting us. This morning is bright and mild. The baby and attendants came over. I stayed home all day.
- 2 Bright pleasant day—stayed home. Mrs. Fithian came to lunch.
- 3 Sunday. Cooler and windy. All three went to Mrs. Fithian's to lunch, and take a drive.
- 4 Frank went in the motor to Los Angeles and met Isabella and brought her home. Bobby came with her. Isabella lunched with Sally and Virginia and Bobby and Isabella dined with us. The baby was here too—and Miss Crangle earlier, I went down town with Sally.
- 5 Bright and mild. Isabella stopped by with the baby on the way to the Ranch. Went in the motor with Sally and later to see Mrs. Oliver who is better. Isabella came to supper and Bobby came later to tell us goodbye as they are going to-morrow. I got a letter from Lizzie H.
- 6 Bright and pleasant. Frank and Sally went with Isabella and Bobby to the early train. I got a letter from Susan
- 7 and sent an answer to her. Wendell Fletcher came to see us. Sally and Frank went to dine at Peabody's and to hear Miss Amy [?] Cryan hold forth. I got letter from Julia. Got from National Bank checks for dividend For 132.00 for 22.00 extra Dividend From B.F. Goodrich check 22.75 from Dyewood Cor. Check 52.50. These were sent from Mrs. Milliken and Matheson brought the mail. Also I got from Cit. Dep. Bk. Cer. Of Dep. 12.00 Div. I stayed home all day. Susan said it was cold and ice in the river Dec. 30. Julia said it was very cold but turned milder.
- 8 Bright and lovely. Frank started for N. York on the morning train. Got letter from Julia Loving. Miss Crangle brought Jack over. Went down town with Sally. We had strawberries for lunch. Left some flowers for Mrs. Oliver. Sent Susan some cream bonds. Went to the beach with Sally who took Jack, Miss C. and Beth—sea beautiful—plenty of gulls. Sally got telegrams from Isabella for Frank.
- 9 Sally got a telegram from Frank. Miss Crangle brought Jack over here at breakfast time. Went down town with Sally. She bought things of antiquary at Historical Adobe. I sent Julia Loving the little frame from Martha. Saw Miss Thera Peterson in town. Got from Farmers' and Mechanics' Bank Wash. letter and check for 35.00. fom Metropolitan Bank Washington also check for 2.00 div. proxy from Natl Met. Bk.
- 10 Bright warm and beautiful. Miss Crangle brought Jack over early. Went with Sally down town. Sent little note to Frances Hill inclosing letter to Fanny G. Bought flower seeds 1.65. Sally put my check in County Natl. Bk. viz.

See 6<sup>th</sup>. Sally took us the baby, Miss C. &c. to the beach.

- 10 Sunday—bright and beautiful. Miss Merrill walked up to see us. Sent Susie Tew letter with flower seeds. Sent Miss R. Cason a note with check for 14.00 on Cit. Dep. Bk. Sally and I went over to Isabella's to see Jack. It is the first time I have been in Isabella's house.
- 11 Beautiful bright day. Miss Crangle brought Jack over. I went down town with Sally. Sent letter to Lily with flower seeds. Sally had a telegram from Frank he had got to N.York. I got Bill from Con. Telephone Co. for rental next year 18. and for Toll 1.62. And cream check 3.43 dated Dec. 31.
- 12 Sally said she was awake and felt a quake tremble very distant with a loud noise just before at 2.30—the servants also felt it. John Greenway was operated on about 9 o'clock this morning by Dr. Peck at Roosevelt Hospital for gall stones. Frank telegraphed that he was 1 hour and 29 minutes under the operation which was said by the doctors to be successful and to be absolutely necessary and that John was conscious afterwards. Frank went on to be with Isabella and said that Martha was also there. Frank has certainly been a father to Isabella since Til died. To-day is a warm summer day. Miss Crangle brough[t] Jack over at breakfast time. After lunch I went down in the motor with Sally. She got from Frank's office N. York a check for me of 135.00 from Eq. Trust Co. of George W. Helme Co. Stock. Sally got my picture which was framed. We went to Mrs. Hazard's to supper to meet her Aunt Mrs. Blake.
- 13 Cloudy and cleared off. Miss Crangle brought Jack over—he was sweeter than usual. Sally went down town. She insisted on paying my telephone bill (see 11) and took it. Sally deposited for me my check 135.00 in County Natl. Bk.(12<sup>th</sup>). Went to see Mrs. Oliver. Sally had telegram about John.
- 14 Clear and cool. Miss Crangle brought Jack over. Went down town with Sally twice, bought some stockings &c. Mrs. Blake and Mrs. Hazard came to tea. It turned very misty looked like rain. Sally got telegram from Frank—about John. I sent letter to Beulah with 2.00.
- 15 Bright and rather cooler. Miss Crangle brough Jack over. I got letter from Susie Tew. Went with Sally to see the play 'Old Man Musick' [?] given by the Amateurs Recreation Arts, poorly played. The orchestra would be criticized in Darkest Africa. Telegram from Frank that John had a bad day. Best forest fire view.
- 16 Cool but clear. Went with Sally to see Miss Seaborg and her partner Miss Ryan. After lunch went to the Movie to see Charlie Chaplin in the Gold Rush boresome. Miss Crangle brought Jack here.
- 17 Sunday. Cloudy and about 3.30 rained a little. Jack teething and did n't come. Sally got telegram that John was thought better. Miss Merrick came. We went to the Clerbois concert at Recreation Centre. Sally went 3 times to see Jack. To-day was cool—fire felt good.
- 18 Cloudy and disagreeable day and a dreary gale at night. Sally went often to see Jack. Dr. Lamb went to see him—thought to be better. Telegram from Frank about John said John's condition was worse. Had a telegram from Mrs. Ballard—saying Mr. Ballard was dead. Sally had a letter from Susan who said Miss Arty Ryle's father was dead. Stayed in the house all day. Turned colder. Susan said the weather had been about zero for 2 weeks letter postmarked 14<sup>th</sup>, and ice still on the river. I got a cream check for 2.87 and note from Julia Loving with Evangelist papers.
- 19 Sally got a telegram that John died—such is life. The baby better Sally says—poor child. The wind last night blew down a tree on the roof of the maids' rooms and made a hole. I sent a note to Miss Arty. Mrs. Fithian came to lunch. Miss Seaborg came afterwards she had had news of John's death. Miss Petey came—told us about the house they bought burning up. Mr. Duane came and later Miss Merrill came.
- 20 Wind last night was worst since that of last July—when the fire burned on Mission Ridge. Cold this morning. The Morning Press had a piece with large head lines about John Greenway. Later I sent and got some papers to keep. Dr. Williams came to see us as a friendly call. I sent a letter to Julia F. Sent a letter to Harry with a cream check for 6.06 as a present to his mother who is ill. Sally got a letter

from Major Hector. Miss Crangle brought Jack over and later they moved over because Isabella's servants are going to Ajo where she expects to be next week. Got a note from Mrs. Oliver. Mr. Proctor and Mr. Hollister came and also Mr. and Mrs. Cate. Mrs. Chatfield Taylor an old friend of John's came.

- 21 Did n't write in this till the next day. Cold and bright—stayed home. Sent letter to Mrs. Ballard. Dr. Lamb came to see Jack and said he was all right. Paper says cold wave is moving east. Sally got telegrams about Isabella from Frank. They are all going to Ajo.
- 22 Bright and milder. Got card from Susie T. Mrs. Fithian came—brought flowers & fruit. Mrs. Campbell sent card. Sally got telegrams from Bell Breck, Mrs. D. Robinson, Frank. Jack well and playing.
- 23 Bright and milder. Got letter from Lily G. she said it had been 6 below 0 with ice in the river for some time. Stayed home.
- 24 Sunday. Bright and rather cold. Stayed home. Miss Esther Hammond came to see Sally. Petey called up. I sent a letter to Lily Grant. Sally got a telegram from Frank from El Paso.
- 25 Bright and cool. Sally got a telegram from Frank. I got letter from Fanny G. in Mt. Washington. Got a Spirit of Missions from Susie with picture of E. Convention. Dr. Lamb was here to see Jack—said he was all right. Got a note from Miss Roxanne Cason in answer to mine (see 10<sup>th</sup>) in which she says I have paid her in full to January 6<sup>th</sup>.
- 26 Bright and cool. I saw the baby Jack take several steps alone. His father's funeral took place this morning at Ajo. Sally got a telegram and a letter from Frank written on the train. Mrs. Chatfield Taylor brought book for Jack. Miss Marin called—later Miss Merrill came. John C. Greenway buried at Ajo, Arizona.
- 27 The Morning Press had a piece about the funeral of John Greenway yesterday at Ajo, which I cut out. Bright and mild. I got letter from Julia Loving—and cream check for 2.58. Sally got letters from Miss Mary Selmes and Charlie F. Later I got letter from Flora Arnold about John's death.
- 28 Bright and clear. Matheson went to Los Angeles for Frank who came with Mrs. Proctor who stayed to lunch. I got letters from Lucy J. and Lily Grant. Later Miss Merrill came.
- 29 Rained last night and this morning but stopped. Mrs. Fithian came. After lunch I went motoring with Miss Crangle and Jack.
- 30 Did n't write in this. I sent letter to Lucy J. The day was cloudy, and sprinkled a little and after dark rained gently. Miss Cate came. After lunch I went to motor with Miss Crangle and the baby. Got letter from Laura D. At night it rained hard and thundered but I did not hear it.
- 31 Sunday. Rained off and on. Isabella telephoned that she was n't coming now. I sent letter to Susie T. and paper to Lily about John. We went to Mrs. Fithian's to tea. Sally took her her desk present. It poured down rain again.

## February

- 1 Bright—cleared off, and then clouded up. I got letter from Julia Foster. Sent paper about John G. and little note to Sally Chenault. Got a letter from Ridie Tevis and cream check for 2.53. Sally got clippings from Mrs. Ballard about Mr. Ballard.
- 2 Rained hard after noon. We all went down town before. Sally insisted on giving me a check to pay for Beulah &c. I did n't want to take it but she got a draft for \$225. and I sent it to C. E. McNeely cas. Cit. Dep. Bk. Grant Ky for deposit. I sent Miss Roxanna Cason check for 25.00 on Cit. Dep. Bk. 25.00. Sent Mr. Proctor's newspaper Tucson to him by P.O. It went the 2d. Sent letter to Isabella.
- 3 Looked like rain all day but did n't rain. Went down town with the others. Sally stopped to see Miss Petey. Frank and Sally packed and prepared to go to Ajo to-morrow.
- 4 It must have rained a little as the newspaper was wet. Misty and gloomy. Frank, Sally, Miss Crangle and Jack left on the early train for Los Angeles and Ajo. Probably I will not see Jack again and he is a

lovely child and seems a worthy descendant of papa and is the image of his father. Sally and she intended to come back next week. Miss Crangle brought Jack here Jan. 20<sup>th</sup> and he has been our pet since. Miss Merrill came to see me. After lunch I sent for Miss Petey who came. We then went for a motor ride down to Channel Drive and the highest surf since I have been here and a crave [cave?] &c. Stopped to see Mrs. Oliver. Sent letter to Julia Loving.

- 5 Sun out and mild, turned warm. Had a letter from Amy inclosing one to Isabella that Matheson put in the box at the P.O. Also went to the Western Union and he ordered the telegram from Mr. Marsh sent on to Frank. Took Miss Petey down and then took her for a drive to Hope Ranch &c. Telephoned Miss Merrill. 'Earth green' Miss Merrill came later.
- 6 Bright sun. I got check from 37 Wall St. from Am. Gas & Electric Co. for 37.50. Also card from Miss Arty Ryle. Later letter from Harry saying that Susan had a girl baby born January 26. And was doing 'fine'. It was like summer to-day. Mrs. McIntosh Gordon's mother came to see me. We went, Miss Merrill, Miss Peterson and I out to Feather Hill Ranch to see the Zoo. Mrs. Fithian telephone me. Harry asked for a check for 25.00.
- 7 Sunday. Warm and pleasant but hazy. I sent a letter to Harry with a check for 25.00 on Cit. Dep. Bk. Mrs. And Mr. McIntosh came to see me. After lunch Miss Petey and I went for a motor drive up the coast. Matheson said we went 30 miles and back 50 in all. Cut a piece out of the Los Angeles Times about John Greenway's will.
- 8 Lovely spring morning, Matheson said he got a telegram from Frank saying he would be here tomorrow night. I sent a letter to Susan by him with 5.00 present. Got a letter from Amy C. We took a long drive down the ocean and back over the ridge. Mrs. Hodenpf came. Mrs. Dr. Robinson left cards for Sally. I was told that Mrs. Walter Douglas called up Sally. It was really hot motoring. Miss Petey read me a piece about John's funeral in Ajo.
- 9 Tuesday. Matheson went to Los Angeles for Frank and Sally who got home safe thank God. It was a beautiful warm day. Miss Petey went home afterwards. Miss Merrill came to see me as they were going on a motor trip. Sally left all well at Isabella's. Lily Grant died.
- 10 Foggy. Mr. Carl Taylor came from Los Angeles. I got cream check for 3.32. Later a letter from Lizzie H. Mrs. Fithian came to supper.
- 11 Heavy fog. Carl Taylor's father and mother, sister and her husband Mr. Allen, came to call on their way to Los Angeles and Carl went back with them. Later I got letter from Sally Mallory. It blew and rained and then poured.
- 12 Earth drenched—cloudburst in Montecito last evening. Frank started for Tucson by the early train. I got a letter from Mrs. Mary Grant telling me that Lily was ill and thought to be dying. Sally telegraphed Frances. It poured again. I sent note to Frances. I poured off and on all the evening and at night. Sally stayed in bed.
- 13 Poured off and on last night and this morning. Sun came out about noon. Mrs. Dr. Williams came to see Sally, who is in bed. Rained later.
- 14 Sunday. Rained off and on gently. Frank came home before lunch from Tucson. He said Isabella and Martha were there. Rain continued.
- 15 Cloudy and chilly. I got a note from Flora Arnold telling me that Lily died the 9<sup>th</sup>, the note was written the 10<sup>th</sup>. A true heart is at rest. I also got letters from Fanny G. and Lizzie H. both having heard of John Greenway's death. I endorsed the check for 37.50 (see 6<sup>th</sup>) and gave it to Frank who cashed it and gave me the 37.50. Mrs. Dr. Williams came to see Sally. I sent letter to Lizzie H. and to Frances G. Got from Cit. Dep. Bk. Grant Ky. a Certificate of deposit for \$225.00 (see 2<sup>nd</sup>). Got cream check for 2.67 of Feb. 9. Miss Merrill came.
- 16 Bright day. Martha came and had an appointment with Dr. Allen dentist. I sent a letter to Fanny Gibbon. Miss Petey came.

- 17 Bright and beautiful. Martha went to the dentist twice. [in margin] Ash Wednesday. Mrs. Dr. Williams came to see Sally. Dave Goodrich lunched with us. I got letter from Miss Mary Selmes. Martha went to Carpenteria and to Virginia's to supper.
- 18 Bright beautiful day. Sent letter to Miss Mary Selmes. There was a quake at about 10.12 a real shock that we felt as if the walls would come down. I got card from Lucy. Sally got letter from Harriet both in Florida. Frank says the men in the Press Building where his office is ran out and the people said it was the worst quake since the big one. Got letter from Julia Loving.
- 19 Martha went away on the early train. Frank brought me from her a note from Mrs. McIntosh that she apparently forgot to give me when she was here. Got a letter from Susie T. who had had influenza later letters from Amy C. and Julia F.
- 20 Cloudy no sunshine. A letter came from Beulah. The sun came out. After lunch I took a drive, the country looked green and lovely. Mr. Hagedorn the author called and Frank introduced him. When I got home Miss Seaborg and Miss Ryan were here. I sent a note to Mrs. McIntosh 2235 Washington St. San Francisco, Gordon's mother. I went to see Mrs. Oliver but she was out. The wind blew hard later.
- 21 Sunday. Clear and cooler—stayed home. Miss Merrill came to call. Sally better.
- 22 Washington's birthday. Went down town for the drive—got a letter from Susan saying Cleo had come home for good, and Susan's baby is named Mary Ruby. Mrs. Whitehead came to see us. Sent a letter to Beulah with 5.00. Cousin Dave G. came to see us.
- 23 Bright and mild. After lunch I went to see Mrs. Oliver, Mr. Duane came. Mr. and Mrs. Cate and then Judge and Mrs. Lovett. Dave called up to tell Sally goodbye. I got cream check for
- 24 Bright and mild. Sent letter to Mrs. Mary Grant. Think I stayed home all day.
- 25 Went down town when Frank went—paper says it was 82° to-day. Mrs. Dr. William came to see Sally.
- 26 A summer day. Mocking birds sang in the bushes all day. I got a letter from Miss Crangle. Took a drive before sunset, country beautiful.
- 27 Another summer day—stayed at home. Mrs. Dr. Williams came to see Sally. Later Mrs. Hazard and Miss Merrill came. Sally walked a little and ate supper at the table.
- 28 Sunday. A Heavenly day as to weather. Frank lunched with the Cates. I got a letter from Frances Grant and sent one to her by Matheson. I went to Mrs. Fithian's and took her scarf—went to see Mrs. Oliver too. Sally was at the table at lunch.

## March

- 1 Cloudy all day. Got a letter from Lizzie Hodges. Sally got one from Beulah. Stayed home.
- 2 Lovely day but had clouds. Sally got letter from Susan who told about a horrid storm that broke trees &c. I sent letter to Susan. Mrs. Dr. Williams came to see Sally—said she could take a drive so we went after lunch to see the ocean. Miss Peterson sent us beautiful flowers and notes supposing it was my birthday—just as highly prized as if it were. Sally also sat at table at lunch and supper. I got a cream check for 2.68. Mr. Cameron Squires called Frank up and told him that his mother was dead.
- 3 Foggy and drizzled, rained off and on. Got a letter from Fanny G. telling of the death of Mitty Gibson Foster. She died at Ingleside suddenly. Went for a little drive with Sally.
- 4 Heavy fog and looked like rain. Mrs. Fithian called. I sent Martha a note and clippings. Stayed home. Frank went to polo.
- 5 Cloudy all day. Sent letter to Julia F. Sally sent check to Beulah 15.00. I got birthday letter from Isabella. Frank went to polo game with Mrs. Fithian. Wonderful sunset.
- 6 Frank's and my birthday. Did n't write in this. Frank got birthday telegram for us from Isabella. He lunched at the club with a man's party. Mrs. Fithian came to lunch with us and brought beautiful

flowers. I am thankful to be on foot and not to have outlived all my sense. Bless the Lord Oh my soul and forget not all his benefits. Sally better on the sofa and at the table.

- 7 Sunday. Bright and mild—lovely and the country greener than last year. Went with Frank to the polo game at Cox field—the game was between S.B. and Midwrik latter beat. Sally seems better.
- 8 Bright and rather cooler. Mrs. Dr. Williams came to see Sally, Frank went to L.A. on the way to Ajo. Matheson took him. I sent by him note to Miss Crangle with wash rag for Jack. A remarkable sunset. After sundown it turned colder and rained a little. Matheson got back after 8 o'clock.
- 9 Bright and cooler. Got a present from Fanny Gibbon a pretty bag. Also a Childs check from N.Y. for 26.25. Also a cream check for 2.18 and some local invitations. Went for a motor ride with Sally—got Eau de Quinine 1.50.
- 10 Bright and cool early—went with Sally to see Russell Cheney's paintings. Mrs. Alec Lambert and Mrs. Coles called.
- 11 Bright, heavenly day. Went with Sally to Channel D\_\_d and got out and watched the ocean. Sent letter to Lucy J. Sent letter to Miss Cason with check for 25.00 on Cit. Dep. Bk. Sent letter to Susan with Zinnia seed. Mr. and Mrs. Condert of Long Island called. Sally was able to go and have her hair washed.
- 12 Bright and beautiful, Sally's St. Paul acquaintances came. Mrs. Barrows and Mrs. Hill, Walter Hill's Ex. Sally went for Frank who came from Ajo. Went to take motor drive with Mrs. Oliver. Frank went to polo.
- 13 Bobby's birthday 18 to-day. Lord love his life. I wish him every good. I got letter from Fanny Gibbon for my birthday and letter from Susan of the 8<sup>th</sup> said it was cold with snow. Also got letter from the store-keeper Mr. Lewis L. Stephens with my account since we left for things Beulah and Harry bought 18.35. Mr. Stephens is going out of the business to farm and wants his money. Sally got letter from Julia Loving. Got Post Card from Robert Breckenridge. Sally and Frank went to polo, came back soon.
- 14 Lovely day. Sent to Mr. McNeely cas. Cream checks (13 I think) to be deposited for me. Sent note to Mr. Stephens with check on Cit. Dep. Bk. for 18.35 for my store account. Sunday.
- 15 Lovely summer morning. Matheson says he saw wild geese flying south. Went with Sally yesterday for a drive down to the Cox polo ground and back to take Frank—forgot to put it down. To-day went down town with Sally. Got from Childs' Co. check for 26.25. Endorsed this and the other Childs' check (see 9<sup>th</sup>) and gave them to Frank and he had them cashed and sent me the money 52.50 by Sally. Got a letter from Miss Cason of the 10<sup>th</sup> saying Beulah was sick with influenza. Sent Miss Cason letter. Got cream check for 1.99. Weather changed since noon turned foggy and cooler.
- 16 Heavy fog and chilly. Sent letter to Fanny Gibbon and forgot to write it down. To-day sent note to Susan with cream check bonds and letter to Julia Loving.
- 17 St. Patrick's Day. Mild and bright—went down town with Sally—stopped at Petey's but did n't get out. Mrs. Dr. Williams came. Later she went with Frank to the polo game. Sally better.
- 18 Lovely day. Went down town with Sally—got envelopes 1.00. Got letter from Miss Mary Selmes of 12<sup>th</sup>. Cap. Dickinson of the Community Chest came.
- 19 Rained last night gently and drizzling off and on this morning. Sent note to Miss Cason asking about Beulah. Sally sent her a dress. I went to Mrs. Oliver's—she was n't home. Took a drive. Sally got letter from Martha. The N. Y. Times said Bobby's polo team beat Harvard. Folger on the team.
- 20 Beautiful day. Got letter from Miss Annie of March 14 saying Beulah is out of danger and able to sit up some. She says Dr. Yelton made two trips to see her. I sent note to Miss Annie. Went with Frank to a tea at Mrs. Hazard's—met Dr. Hadley of Yale a friend of Tilden's.
- 21 Sunday. Beautiful day. After lunch we went to Mr. Marwick's beach—ocean beautiful and we went through Hope Ranch.

- 22 Isabella's birthday. Frank and Sally talked with her a long distance. Heavenly day—mocking birds singing madly. After I woke up I made all good wishes for Isabella before I got up. Lord love her. We went after lunch down to the Beach Club—ocean grand. Stopped at Miss Petey's coming home. Mr. Proctor was here to supper and spend the evening.
- 23 Lovely summer morning. Sent letter to Isabella and one to Beulah with 1.00. Went down town with Sally after Frank. After lunch went in the motor. Got Cream check for 1.00. The paper said it was 95° very hot. Miss Merrill came.
- 24 Cooler and partly foggy. A letter came to me from Mrs. Eva McAllister Pritchett written in Cairo! Later got one from Mammy. Sent letter to Susie Tew. Went for a drive with Sally in Mission Cañon &c.
- 25 Foggy and damp. Frank and Sally talked with Isabella on long distance. I sent letter to Miss Mary Selmes. Sent postage for a paper in Cin. got the notice came 23d I think [sic]. Stayed home—it drizzled part of the day.
- 26 Frank went on the early train to meet Isabella at Dr. Ricket's on business. Got letter from Susie Tew. Went down town with Sally and to see the ocean. Misty though the sun came out. Got tooth powder 1.00. Received from Cit. Dep. Bk. certificate of deposit of the cream check I sent 14<sup>th</sup> = 42. Frank came home at night and Isabella and Martha came with him.
- 27 Did n't write in this. Isabella went away about noon. Matheson took her to Los Angeles. Martha stayed with us. Mrs. Fithian and Dorothy lunched here and Mrs. Cate came too. Dorothy was to start to-day for N.Y. on her way to France. Martha took me to see Mrs. Oliver and then she went to see Virginia. Sally has a picture of Jack I. gave her.
- 28 Palm Sunday. Misty and cool, sun came out to set. Martha went to church. Mr. Proctor came to lunch. Then they went to dine with Virginia. Frank, Sally and I took a long drive—by the mountain drive down to Sandy land road—and back.
- 29 Lovely spring day. Cap. And Mrs. Davy, Virginia[s] sister and Virginia lunched here later Mr. Proctor & Miss Erving came. I sent letter to Ridie F. got one from Julia F.
- 30 Cloudy chilly day. Went down town with Sally. Got note from Isabella with picture of her house also Easter card from Marion Resor and cream check for 1.59. Later got letter from Lucy J. Went with Sally to Petey's to try on my dress that Mrs. Harson is making.
- 31 Cloudy and chilly again. Martha went away on her return to Ajo. Virginia Barlett [or Bartell?] is to go with her. I got a letter from Lizzie Hodges. It drizzled a little to-day—turned cooler.

## April

- 1 Rained or drizzled a little this morning, foggy and cloudy most of the day. After lunch we went to Mr. Holmes' Feather Hill Ranch. Mrs. Oliver and Mrs. Hooper called while we were gone.
- 2 Good Friday. Raining off and on. Sent letter to Harry. After lunch went down town with Sally.
- 3 Frank Said it rained last night. Was a pleasant day. I went down town with Sally before lunch and after went to Miss Petey's to get my dress. Got letter from Laura D. and one from Harry asking for a check for 66.00 to pay his store bill. Miss Meril[] came. Mr. Wood, Nannie Honeyman [?] and Judith came.
- 4 Easter Sunday. Raining a slow drizzle and off and on pouring. After lunch Sally and Frank went to see Mr. Bliss and when they got home it poured for hours. Peter Folger telegraphed that Bobby who went to Pittsburgh to play polo was in the Hospital there with scarlet fever. Frank telephoned Isabella \_\_\_ long distance—she said Bobby had sent her a telegram. I sent Harry a letter with a check for 66.00 on Cit. Dep. Bk.
- 5 Poured last night and still at it and it kept up during the day and after sundown. I stayed home. Sally went to have a dress fitted. They got telegrams and telephones about Bobby from Dave Goodrich, Isabella &c. Favorable.

- 6 Rained a little, sun out and in. More telegraphs about Bobby—still favorable. Got cream check for 1.30. Also got 3 checks sent by Mrs. Milliken Un. Dye Co. 52.50 B. F. Goodrich 22.75 and G. W. Helme 22.50 total 97.75. After lunch went with Sally down town. Sent letter to Julia F. Went to Mrs. Olivers, not at home, saw rainbow and little showers and April sun. Got picture framed of Isabella's Ajo house.
- 7 Rained last night and pouring to-day. Sent letter to Lizzie H. and to Laura D. At night went with S. and F. to the Country Club to the meeting of the Cosmopolitan Club as Mrs. Hazard's guest. M. Henré lectured on the flora of the mountains—he is from Switzerland. It rained in torrents with thunder and lightning before we started home and afterwards and was storming when I went to sleep.
- 8 Raining and sun shining by turns. Frank started by train for Ajo. I got receipt and check from Farmers' and Mechanics' Bk. Wash. for 21.00. Always heretofore in [sic] has been twenty-eight—what's up! or rather what's down? Miss Merrill came.
- 9 Sun came out, mild. Sally got telegram from Frank—good trip—heard Bobby was better. Got letter from Beulah. Sent her letter with 5.00. Went down with Sally—got a new percale dress 2.40. Left it for Mrs. Hanson. Got a letter from Frances Grant.
- 10 Gloomy—sun came out. Went down town with Sally. She put my 4 checks (see 6<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>) in the County National Bk. total 118.75. I got Co\_t C. 1.50 and Ponds Ex. 1.00. Sent letter to Amy C.
- 11 Sunday. Sister Belle's birthday. I wish her peace, perfect peace. Bright but turned windy. Sally got telephone from Frank—that Bobby is better. Went with Sally to Recreation Centre to Cherbois concert. George Gramlich sang. We stopped at El Mirasol to see Mr. Bliss. I sent a letter to Near East, Relief Louisville, with a check for 10.00 on Boone Co. Dep. Bk. Burlington.
- 12 Lovely spring morning. Mrs. Barnes who used to live at El Encanto came to see us. Sally went to lunch with Mrs. Forbes. Afterwards we went to the Beach Club, it is deserted as usual. Sally got telephone from Frank.
- 13 Lovely spring day. I sent letter to Susan. Frank came home from Ajo said Bobby was getting well. Sent letter to Julia Loving. I went to see Mrs. Oliver. Got note from Lizzie. Warm as summer, thundered far off sometimes.
- 14 Warm and bright. Went down town with Sally. Sent letter to Frances G. bought Eau de Quinine .85. Sally sent and took flowers to Mrs. Hazard. Early and late fog.
- 15 Heavy fog—then sun came out. Later it thundered often and there was rain. Stayed home all day. Sally got a letter from Susan of the 10<sup>th</sup> saying she could not cook for me.

We left home September 18<sup>th</sup> 1925

We got to Santa Barbara Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> 1925
